History of UCR

The roots of the UCR campus were formed during the boom of the citrus industry, California's second gold rush.



In 1907, at the urging of the Riverside orange growers, the state approved the opening of the Citrus Experiment Station for the purpose of pioneering citriculture research in soil management, irrigation, plant breeding, entomology, and plant pathology.



The University of California Riverside was founded in 1954 in the same locale as the citrus research station. UCR continues its legacy of the past with renowned programs in plant sciences and related disciplines.
